NASAL DILATORS (4/14)

Introduction

The nostril region of the nose is a frequent site of nasal obstruction in patients. This nasal valve region and its surrounding area can be compromised by many changes including:

- Septal deviation
- Common cold, hayfever, nasal allergy
- Scarring from burns, surgery or trauma
- Bell's palsy or stroke
- Aging of the nasal skin and cartilages
- Cosmetic nasal surgery.

There are surgical procedures that can correct these problems. Alternatively there are many mechanical therapeutic devices on the market, which may be beneficial.
